





# PROPERTY TAXES






11 ARC COUNTIES | TOTAL BOC-CONTROLLED PROPERTY TAX (2023)






# 2024 ARC POPULATION ESTIMATES





## GROWTH HISTORY






POPULATION GROWTH SINCE 1991

# GROWTH MANAGEMENT - WHAT IF?





County & Cities agree to Targets



Growth Weighted toward Cities



Averaged over Muliple Years & Adjusted Periodically



New Approvals up to 43% Lower if all Entitled Units Built

## ROADS



### ANNUAL ROAD IMPROVEMENT BUDGET NEEDED

AVG. FOR CTP PROJECTS	\$27.5 MILLION
REPAVING ON 25-YEAR CYCLE	\$9.1 MILLION
IN-HOUSE PROJECTS (PUBLIC WORKS)	\$6.2 MILLION
ENGINEERING AND CONTRACT MGMT.	\$1 MILLION

TOTAL BUDGET NEED:

\$43.8 MILLION

## POSSIBLE SOURCES OF ADDITIONAL ROAD FUNDING

#### 1% HOST

## \$64 MILLION PER YEAR

75% to property tax reduction (100% of County M&O for homeowners) 25% to capital projects/roads

\$16 Million (County share = \$12 Million)

70% ROAD IMPROVEMENT FUNDING GAP + SIGNIFICANT PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

#### 0.5% TSPLOST

## \$32 MILLION PER YEAR

Roads/Transportation Only

\$24 Million (County Share)

Net additional tax. No property tax relief.

CLOSE CURRENT GAP AND ALLOW \$8 MILLION PER YEAR FOR PROJECTS NOT IN CTP

## WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

- National Crisis as Housing Costs Outstrip Overall Inflation
- Cherokee's Slow-Growth Policies Aggravate it
- 40% of County's Residents are Housing-Burdened
- Causes Homelessness; Prevents Recovery
- Includes Good People We Need
- Economic & Political Problem

## Cities and County Agree to:

- 17% Subsidized Apartments Starting under \$875/mo.
- √ 13% Moderately Priced Rental Units Staring Under \$1500/mo.
- √ 10% Entry Level Owner-Occupied (low \$300's).
- Different Mix for County & Each City to Achieve Overall Balance
- Incorporate into Comp Plans to give Weight in Zoning
- Continue to Underserve Demand
- Affordable Units in Appropriate Places
